MOUNTAIN VIEW MIDDLE SCHOOL BUS STOP INDEX INSTRUCTIONS

1. Locate your elementary zone A.M. bus stop file and open it.
2. Locate the closest stop to your home.
3. Note the time for the A.M. pick-up. Please have your student arrive no less than 5 minutes early to the bus stop.
4. Open the MVMS A.M. Shuttle Information link. Locate your elementary school and note the RT numbers for their MVMS Shuttles. (E.g. Ridge Crest to MVMS in the morning is RT 5 and RT 7).
5. For afternoon take home, locate your elementary zone under Secondary P.M. Bus Stops.
6. Locate the closest bus stop to your home address. **Our stops are not the exact same in the morning and the afternoon!!!** Note the SLOT number.
7. The afternoon bus hub is located between I.T. Stoddard and the Blackfoot Performing Arts Center. All MVMS students requiring bus transportation after school will load onto eight shuttle buses that will park in the bus loading zone at MVMS. The students may load onto any of these buses. These buses will transport the students to the bus hub, where the rest of the fleet will be waiting. Once at the hub, students need to locate the SLOT number for their P.M. take home bus. The slot numbers are painted on the sidewalk at the hub. Provide your student with their complete take home information (slot number and stop address/description).

IMPORTANT NOTICE!

All MVMS students requiring bus transportation after school **MUST RIDE THE SHUTTLES! IF STUDENTS WALK BETWEEN SCHOOLS, THEY WILL BE DENIED SERVICE FOR THE DAY.** It is District Policy for the safety of students and staff that students are required to utilize the shuttles after school.

Please note that a bus pass is only necessary if your student is riding a different bus than their usual take-home bus, or they are brand new to the district.
